International evangelist Luis Palau wrote a fantastic book called *Changed By Faith... Dare to Trust God with Your Broken Pieces and Watch What Happens*. It's a good read for the Christian who is seeking a deeper walk with Christ and a more powerful Christian experience.

Palau has an amazing story and shares much of it in the book.

He reaches the reader who has faced pain and

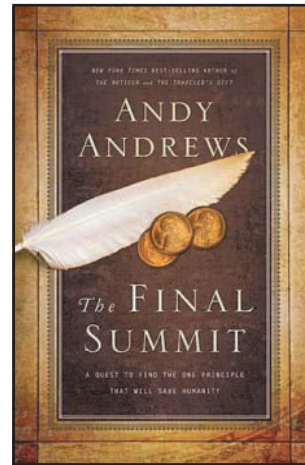

a combined 100 hours a week, making her consistently sick every other month. She admits, "Anything that was done, was done by us. If girls needed food, we ate ramen so they could eat. Anyone that would call, I would meet with them, I would mentor them. We gave of ourselves mentally, physically, emotionally, and spiritually." People would give Joy gifts and instead of enjoying them, she gave them to girls. She is grasping that having a life complementary to one's mission is equally as important. "I'm learning that we can have a life, a marriage, and friendships."

Vince's mentorship has helped Joy to understand this notion, which she passes on to her team. Krystal Altman moved with her family from Virginia specifically to work with Verve and help girls. She now serves as Social Cupcake, planning events and club visits including delivering cupcakes, birthday gifts, and meals to 3-6 clubs every week. She agreed, "It can become intense and overwhelming at times and we have to remember to set healthy boundaries for us and our families."

Other challenges come with such a significant ministry. While girls may welcome the love and care they receive, many are not able to handle it. "The girls have been let down so much that they easily let down others," said Joy remembering when The Cupcake Girls raised money for a girl to go to rehab only to find she checked herself out soon after. "There are times when you feel like you care more

about the girl's health and safety than they do. It can be frustrating and disheartening when you offer help but it is rejected," Vince added. Trust is not something easily earned in the industry according to Krystal, "But we are in for the long haul and as Joy tells us, 'it is a marathon not a sprint.'"

If Joy is the heart of this mission then the volunteers are its backbone, and its contributors are the life support. The Cupcake Girls are solely supported by donations of time, money, creativity, love and other resources. This month is the One-for-One fundraiser. For every box (a dozen) of cupcakes bought, one is given to a club enabling them to visit and invest in the women there.

"The people that choose to support us with their finances keep us going," Joy told the Answer Newspaper. They have a whole host of services for the girls that are available because everyday people are willing and wanting to help. These are free services including a doctor, dentist, therapist, tutor, family services, immediate assistance, job help, and connection to government aid. They have also been able to serve the children by taking them from often times unhealthy environments to the Lied Discovery Museum or out for pizza and swimming.

Their fruit is evident, though 'thank you's' are few. The club manager would not let them on the property before giving into her girls' pleas. That manager now exclaims, "What you do is valued

here!" It's the woman and her young daughter who credit The Cupcake Girls with saving their lives and making them a family again. It's in the faces of the 15 girls' and their families at Krystal Altman's home on Thanksgiving Day, voicing their gratitude. And the 20 families that received wrapped gifts last Christmas. And the ladies who were invited to a Tiffany's-themed spa day that included women from clubs they had yet to visit. The proof is in over 150 women they've counseled and 24 that have asked for assistance to leave the industry.

The ultimate goal is that every industry girl knows that The Cupcake Girls are here for them. Joy has dreams for a building to run a women's resource center and a safe house to protect girls from pimps and other dangerous situations. Yet, all the funds and donations again do not work without people. They

will need managers for those facilities and as always more volunteers and resources to connect the girls to. "More funding and more people is the way we grow."

Joy's convictions serve as a challenge to every follower of Jesus Christ, "Why do not we love people because God calls us to love them, because we all need love and support?" The relationships built are not just with the dancers, but the bouncers, DJs, even the club managers. They all deserve love, respect, and care. There are too many accounts of misguided Christians hiding in bathrooms damning people to hell or handing out ineffective tracks.

Before God's call Joy Hoover had never set foot in a strip club. In college she had aspired to be a social worker, but opted out because she thought she was too emotional. However, she is finishing up school at Paul Mitchell to have another

avenue to serve these women. "Most people's goals in life are to be successful. My goal is to inspire with my love." Her passion is dangerous and can be scary, but she can say with piercing conviction in her voice that she would give her life for this ministry. She urges, "God might be calling you to that which scares you. Courage is not the absence of fear, it is moving forward in the face of fear. Courage is the absence of self."

Vince explained, "There are more slaves in our world today than at any time in the history of mankind. And the church needs to step up and do something. October doesn't have to be all about red devils and jack-o-lanterns, instead it can be about Peace, Love and Cupcakes. It can be about compassion, rather than condemnation."

Healthy Peanut Butter Cookies

On the hunt for a healthy treat to bake for my family, I scoured through several recipes online for "healthy cookies." I wanted something with no refined flour, no refined sugar and no peat moss after-taste. Some recipes called for ingredients that sounded anything but delicious. Others seemed quite time-consuming or tedious. But when I found a recipe for *Peanut Butter & Honey Cookies* on food.com, I knew I'd stumbled upon something good.

I adapted the recipe to fit the items I had in my pantry, and the cookies that resulted from this experiment are incredibly dreamy, totally healthy and perfect to give to

your kids without feeling any guilt at all. Make sure to have a glass of milk handy when these are finished baking.

Cookies

- 1 cup oats, ground
- 2 cups natural peanut butter (salted)
- 1/2 cup honey or agave nectar
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Combine everything in a food processor, or by hand. If you are using honey, heat the honey until it is thin before adding it to the mixture. Then roll the dough into 1-inch balls; press them down onto a cookie sheet and use a fork to make that little criss-crossy thing we always put on peanut butter cookies.

Bake at 350 degrees for 8-10 minutes. (Use a timer - PB cookies seem to burn ever so easily).



Homemade Laundry Soap

- 1/2 bar of Fels-Naptha soap – grated
 - 1/2 cup washing soda
 - 1/2 cup borax
 - water
1. Grate the soap and place in an old sauce pan. Add 6 cups of water and heat until the soap melts.
 2. Add the washing soda and borax and stir until it is dissolved. Remove from heat.
 3. Pour 4 cups of hot water into

- a bucket. Add the soap mixture and stir. Add 1 gallon plus 6 cups of water and mix well.
 - 4. Set aside mixture for 24 hours. It will thicken. Store it covered and use 1/2 cup with each load of laundry.
- This will make about 2 gallons of laundry soap. Fels-Naptha soap, as well as the other ingredients, can be found at most grocery stores in the cleaning aisle.

Go After the Deep Things of God

Are you spiritually remaining on the surface never seeking to get below it, content with mediocrity, or satisfied with the routine of making do? I realize that staying with the familiar, the place that affords us the most ease and comfort in our understanding and personal actions, is sufficient for some.

However, God calls those that belong to Him to draw closer and go deeper in the knowledge of Jesus Christ. This revelation came after having to acknowledge that I was complacent in areas of my life, and it birthed a spiritual dissatisfaction that weighed on me. I believe that weight was conviction and a prompting to move out of complacency. I have come to know that complacency is an enemy to the believer, because it robs the believer of spiritual depth, potential, and appointed destiny.

One day I woke up and realized that passivity had even crept in through the door of complacency. Isn't it wonderful how God lovingly reveals one's spiritual condition to produce change and deliverance?

The Spirit of God began to place within me a desire to want to go

deeper. I thank the Lord that there is not any such thing as too deep where He is concerned. The word of God assures us that if we draw closer to Him then He will draw nearer to us (James 4:8). In other words, the Lord will come kissing close and unlock the doors of revelation in our lives. I have come to realize that it is important to go after the deep things of God and this is not done without personal sacrifice.

Oftentimes, certain personal challenges have to be faced to get deeper. True progression in Christ never comes without self examination and sacrifice. Going into the depths of God requires greater effort and discipline in our study, prayer, fasting, praise & worship. Once achieved, a new revelation unfolds along with the discovery that every effort was worth it.

The child of God then discovers that going deep causes us to become deep. Not the kind of "deep" that religious form or fashion displays, but the kind that comes from having a serious relationship with God. It is the kind of depth that comes from revelation knowledge illuminating the person of God and one's own spiritual identity. This is the

delight of the "depth experience" and its reward, not only is great intimacy with Christ but a greater spiritual walk. God will reward those that diligently seek Him; and that reward is the deep infusion of His presence, knowledge, and wisdom into our lives (Hebrews 11:6).

In the bible, Jesus instructs Peter and his fellow fisherman "to launch into the deep" (Luke 5:4). One cannot launch out into the deep if there is an unwillingness to move from the shorelines. He instructs them to launch out because the best catch is found in the deep; there

might be certain sea life that can be caught off of the shore line but others require launching out. As believers, we are unable to get all that we need from the spiritual shoreline of our lives; however, if we are willing to launch out there will be a great spiritual harvest awaiting.

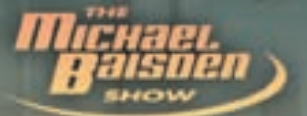
